


About the NEER

- A central repository that will allow the public and private sectors to transparently track attributes associated with energy efficiency initiatives
- Will help states demonstrate progress towards energy goals and potential compliance with existing and future energy and carbon regulation
- Built on best practice
 - Registry design
 - EE accounting and reporting protocols
- Will be able to track energy conservation and other types of reduction efforts





Attribute Registries


Attribute registries come in all shapes and sizes





Basic Registry Elements

 Basic elements are found in most attribute registries supporting various policies





NEER Development Elements

Principles and operating rules + roadmap for states

Sector-specific protocol database for states and programs



Software functional requirements

Software launch and administration



NEER Objectives

 Provide a consistent framework for EE to be included as an "eligible resource" in federal and state plans

 Demonstrate verification of EE projects according to the appropriate eligibility standards

Facilitate the opportunity for inter- and intrastate trading



NEER as a Tool

- Not prescribe EM&V but will outline consistent requirements for data
- Aggregate rate payer and non-rate payer programs
- Support the development of financial instruments representing verified EE saving
- Be flexible to support a range of EE projects and program types



NEER Support of State Efforts

- Lowers the cost associated with administering energy efficiency programs and policies
- Streamlines energy efficiency project EM&V
- Supports state energy and environmental planning efforts
- Avoids double counting of energy savings
- Creates greater transparency of energy efficiency programs and impacts



NEER Project Timeline

Timeframe	Task
March – April 2016	Formation of Multi-stakeholder Working Group & Steering/Advisory Committee
April 2016 – February 2017	Multi-stakeholder Working Group to draft NEER Principles and Operating Rules
April – May 2017	Public comment period for draft NEER Principles and Operating Rules
September 2017	Final roadmap for state adoption and implementation
October 2017	Key functional platform requirements



Multi-stakeholder Working Group

Composed of ~ 125 members

- Ensures draft Principles and Operating Rules meet the needs of all stakeholders
 - Makes recommendations to steering committee

 Ongoing membership pending ability to accommodate additional participants
